Book launch: Special issue of the 'Tér és Társadalom' scientific journal

Budapest, 21st of June 2013

The TRANSMIG (Integrating transnational migrants in transition states) project, financed by the Swiss National Science Foundation investigated the migration processes and their consequences triggered by the Yugoslav Wars and focused on several settlements in Serbia (Vojvodina province) and Hungary. The aim of the research was to reveal the migrant communities' social intergration and attitudes towards majority societies, so as to study how migrant networks operate. The international project was coordinated by the University of Bern, while the project partners were research institutes from Serbia and Hungary. Two research institutes of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences were responsible for the implementation of the project in Hungary: the Institute of Regional Studies, RCERS and the Geographical Institute, RCAES. In Serbia, the Department of Geography at the University of Novi Sad and the Scientific Association of Hungarology Research in Subotica participated in the joint research project. The research results of the TRANSMIG project were published in a special issue (2013/2) of scientific journal 'Tér és Társadalom', the results of which will be presented at this book launch.
